Our Impact


1. Distributed food every 2nd Friday of each month to the Sumter community, senior food boxes (60 & over) every 4th Friday of each month and Food Lion donations every third Sunday of each month.
2. Provided meals to the Sumter Emergency Homeless Shelter on the 3rd Sunday of each month.
3. Provided Christmas toys/bikes to the local community at the annual “Winter Wonderland” event.
4. Provided Samaritans Purse with toys and personal items during the holiday season to be distributed to remote areas around the world.
5. Established partnerships with other organizations to help secure the resources to accomplish our objectives.

2025 By the Numbers!

1. **4,948** Food boxes/bags were given away in 2025

HARVEST HOPE



All about FBCIC!

In February 2020, Rev. George Windley, Jr. envisioned a food pantry to serve Sumter County and surrounding communities, leading to the creation of Agency 208 (First Baptist Community Improvement Corporation-FBCIC). Building on this vision, under the leadership of Board Chairperson Keith Ivey and Food Pantry Coordinator Lori McMichael, with support from a dedicated board and 40 volunteers, the pantry has become a vital community resource.

FBCIC continues to partner with Harvest Hope to distribute food bags to Seniors and the broader community each month. The food pantry has become a trusted source of support for individuals and families in need. As a result of these collaborations, partnering with Harvest Hope, they've distributed over 3,448 food bags through monthly mobile giveaways, 1,475 CSFP senior boxes, and 216 prepared meals from Food Lion to local shelters over the past year. First Baptist Missionary Church generously provides the distribution site.

Since 2020, the church has also hosted "Winter Wonderland," a Christmas toy giveaway providing gifts, bikes, and festive activities to over 450 families. The event features Santa, a live nativity scene, a game truck, horse-drawn carriage rides, and refreshments. FBCIC and Agency 208 are grateful for their ongoing partnership with Harvest Hope and others in the fight against hunger.



FBCIC is a 501c3, non profit organization which provides services to low income families, the elderly, veterans and youth. Such Services include a food pantry, and Christmas toy giveaway.
